CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Entries to be lodged with the Secretary – see details in this Schedule by Wednesday 18th March 2009 – Art Entries close Friday 13/3/09
2. Entries for Cut Flowers will be accepted on Friday 20th March 2009 but will not be accepted on Saturday before judging.
3. All Entries to be entered on entry form and delivered to the Secretary's Office – all exhibits to be ticketed before entering the Exhibition Hall.
4. Exhibits to be in position for judging by 10am Friday 20th March 2009. with the exception of Cut Flowers & Art entries – details in sections.
5. All exhibits must have the Society's class card securely attached. This is the responsibility of the Exhibitor. Stewards will not be responsible if the class ticket becomes detached.
6. The Exhibition Hall will be open to receive entries 8am to 10am on Friday 20th March & 8am to 9.30am on Saturday 21st March 2009.
7. No Exhibit is to be removed from the Exhibition Hall before 3pm on the second day of the Show.
8. Any Exhibitor knowingly making a false entry shall forfeit any prize which may have been awarded and may render himself/herself liable to be disqualified from further competitions.
9. Exhibits must be owned, produced or manufactured by the Exhibitor joint entries by two or more persons is not permitted unless they form a bona fide partnership. Exemptions will be clearly stated. Exhibits to be entered in one class only.
10. Articles that have previously won a prize at a Wingham Show are not eligible to compete.

SECTION 6 – JUNIOR EXHIBITS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY Cont.

11. In the event if a protest to the genuineness of an Exhibit the Stewards may ask to inspect the Record Book in connection With the project (Rural Youth). In the event of a protest in The Cooking Section the Judges reserves the right to question The Exhibitor on the making of the article.
12. Rural Youth classes are open to members of any Rural Youth Club.
13. The Committee reserves the right to alter, cancel or vary any Class in this schedule or refuse an entry.
14. No single entry is to form part of a collection.
15. Whilst the Committee will take every precaution to ensure the Safety of an article sent to the exhibition – the onus is on the Exhibitor and should an article be stolen or lost – the Show Society will NOT be held responsible.
16. The Most Successful Exhibitor will be determined on the Following Point Score – 1st 2 points; 2nd 1 point; Champion 2 points; Reserve Champion 1 point.
17. All exhibitors enter at their own risk and must sign a waiver Form.
18. The Judge's decision will be final and no correspondence Will be entered into.
19. All exhibitors must pay entry to the ground on both days Saturday 21st March and Sunday 22nd March 2009.
20. Any matter not covered in this schedule will be ruled on and Adjudicated by the Chief Steward.
